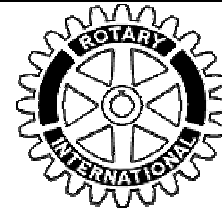

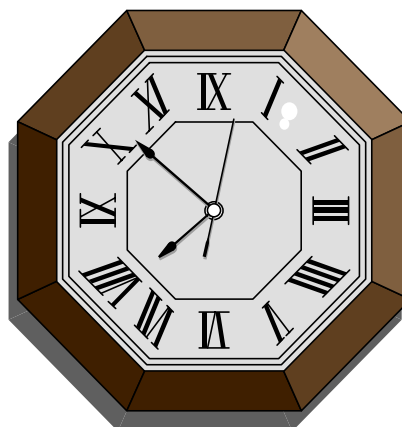

Clubs bring early Christmas festivities to communities

From Australia to Zimbabwe, many communities have kicked off the Christmas holiday with exciting, heart-warming events organized by local Rotary clubs. Members of the Rotary Club of Alresford, England, have kept a 12-year tradition by sponsoring pre-Christmas fireworks on 5 November. Down Under, Governor General Peter Hollingworth, representative of the Queen of England (Australia's head of state), joined the Rotary Club of Belconnen, Canberra, to pack Christmas gift boxes for the homeless and poor families. In San Fernando Valley, California, USA, the Rotary Club of Woodland Hills, is leading local charities in this season of giving with the distribution of 2,000 winter coats for needy school children. The Rotary Club of Bangkok-Benjasiri, Thailand, in conjunction with The Imperial Hotels Group and King Bhumibol College of Music, is initiating "Music in The Park II" at the Benjasiri Park, Sukhumvit Road on three consecutive Saturdays, on 15, 22, and 29 December. This will be a free family event every holiday season. Aiming to kill two birds with one stone, the Rotary Club of Grahamstown Sunset, South Africa, has launched a cookbook to serve as the ideal Christmas gift and in the process raise more money for a local hospice. Featuring more than 80 recipes contributed by the country's mighty and famous — journalists, politicians, writers, sports stars, and entertainers — the cookbook is enticing shoppers to bring culinary cheers to their families this holiday season.

Four Avenues of Rotary Service

Club Service involves all of the activities necessary for Rotarians to perform to make their club function successfully.

Vocational Service is a description of the opportunity each Rotarian has to represent the dignity and utility of one's vocation to the other members.

Community Service pertains to those activities which Rotarians undertake to improve the quality of life in their community. It frequently involves

assistance to youth, the aged, handicapped and others who look to Rotary as a source of hope for a better life.

International Service describes the many programs and activities Rotarians undertake to advance international understanding, goodwill and peace. International projects are designed to meet humanitarian needs of people in many lands.

When a Rotarian understands and travels down the Four Avenues of Service, the object of Rotary takes on an even greater meaning.
