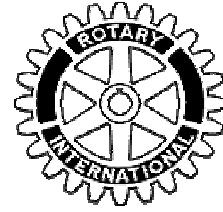

Rotary Corner

RI president announces World Peace events (from the RI website)

To encourage and foster the fourth Object of Rotary - the advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace - Rotary International President Richard D. King has announced plans for three World Peace forums to be held in Jordan, Egypt, and Turkey in early March. The triad of events kicks off with the RI Presidential World Peace Dinner, on 4 March in Amman, Jordan, at the Amman Marriott. Special guests, including the United States ambassador to Jordan, are tentatively scheduled to attend the evening gala.

At the Presidential World Peace Conference, slated for 5-6 March in Cairo, Egypt, President King will be joined by prominent dignitaries such as Egypt's First Lady Suzanne Mubarak, to address the topic of Rotary's role in the important work of promoting world peace. Following a panel discussion, breakout sessions will address themes including multicultural understanding, conflict resolution at the community level, aiding the victims of terrorism and displacement, and what Rotary can do to contribute to international peace. A plenary session dedicated to Rotary's Global Quest and exploring how increasing membership helps to facilitate multicultural understanding will be followed by breakout sessions related to membership, Rotary's public image, and leadership development.

The forums will culminate with the Presidential World Peace Summit, scheduled for 8-10 March at the Ceylon InterContinental Hotel in Istanbul, Turkey. Plenary sessions and breakout discussions will focus on such topics as "Youth as Peacemakers," "The Role of Rotary International in the Peace Process," "How Individual Rotarians Can Contribute to Peace and Understanding in their Communities," and "The Role of the Family in the Peace Process." Breakout sessions on the Global Quest and The Rotary

Foundation will follow. The event will conclude with an interfaith service and a multi-faith panel discussion.
