with this year or how you're going to help in our annual Croquet Tourney.

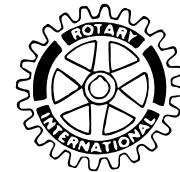

## Outlook for Equities

Dr. Kate Warne from the Edward Jones Equity Research Department gave an excellent talk on the future, or as she sees it as an equities analyst. She believes the economy is picking up and the Canadian market outlook is good. Kate sees the economy rebounding and earnings strengthening. She foresees the leaders being financial (RBC), consumer staples (Loblaw), technology, health care (Pfizer) and

energy (Imperial Oil). The risks are any further terrorist attacks, a Weak European market, Japan imploding, debt getting worse and inflation rising. Edward Jones portfolio strategy is long term buy and hold, quality companies in the growth market, diversification and regular investing. She closed by telling us the importance of reasonable expectations and suggested we have 60-75% equities.
