It's time to start thinking about who you're going to team up with this year or how you're going to help in our annual Croquet Tourney.



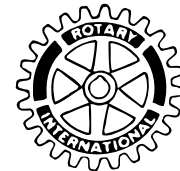

Our speaker last week talked to us about the process of environmental decision making in hydrology.
