## Ambassadorial Scholarships

This Foundation program is the world's largest privately funded international scholarships program.

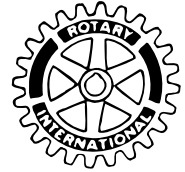
In 1947, 18 Rotary Fellows from 11 countries served as ambassadors of goodwill while studying in another country for one academic year. Since then, approximately US\$335 million has been expended on some 30,000 scholarships for people from more than 125 countries, studying in 105 countries around the world.

The purpose of the program is to further international understanding and friendly relations among people of different countries.

Scholars are expected to be outstanding ambassadors to the people of the host country through both formal and informal appearances before Rotary and non-Rotary clubs. Each scholar is assigned a host Rotarian counsellor to facilitate involvement in Rotary and integration into the host culture. In addition top being an investment in the education of tomorrow's leaders, Rotary Foundation scholarships create personal links between countries and are an important step toward greater understanding and goodwill.
