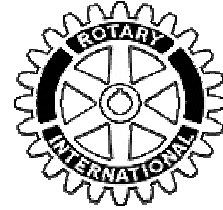

**PROGRAM**

Ted Towers from the Ladner Club, and a well known personality in Delta, told us about the Delta Agricultural Society. Founded in 1888, it is the oldest charitable group in Delta – but unfortunately the least known. Over the years they held many events in Ladner, which used to attract people from all over the lower mainland area – not an easy feat in days of horse and buggy travel and before bridges across the Fraser. The Society started harness racing at the track at Hwy 17 & Ladner Trunk road; it remained very popular until Hwy 17 came through and cut off the parking and access. The society was able to keep the track functional by some fancy negotiating that resulted in the small “jog” we might note in Hwy 17 just after the “White House”. The Agricultural Society has raised much money over the years, and today gives away approximately \$600K per year to non-profit groups in Delta.

Ted Towers was a top harness race driver and still breed race horses.

**ROTARY CORNER**

**RI poster, essay contest to promote spirit of service among youth**

RI President Richard D. King presents an international poster and essay contest aimed at promoting awareness of Rotary in local communities worldwide and educating young people on the concept of service to others. Based on the 2001-02 RI theme: "Mankind Is Our Business" and designed to demonstrate how helping others makes the world a better place, the contest is open to children ages 12-15, one entry in each category per person.

"Through Rotary, we can show our youth how vital service to others really is and affirm that Mankind Is Our Business," says President King. In the poster category, an entrant must submit original artwork that depicts the contest theme on paper size not exceeding 36 inches by 24 inches (150 cm by 100 cm). Essays, also expressing the contest theme, must be between 300 and 500 words, typewritten, and in English, French, Japanese, Korean, Portuguese or Spanish only.

All Rotary clubs are encouraged to invite entries from local youth and to select a winner in each category. Clubs should submit the winning posters and essays to the district-level competition. Districts should then select one winner from each category and submit their selections to Rotary International. All winning entries from the district must be received at RI by 31 December 2001. An international committee will then select the first, second, and third prize winners at the final level. A complete list of winners will be published on the RI Web site at <http://www.rotary.org> after May 2002. At every level, posters and essays will be evaluated based on content and presentation, creativity and imagination, and expression of the contest theme. At the international level, first, second, and third prize winners in each category will receive US\$2,000, \$1,000, and \$500 scholarships respectively. The first and second place winners, their parents, and up to one sibling will travel to the 2002 RI Convention in Barcelona, Spain, at RI's expense.
