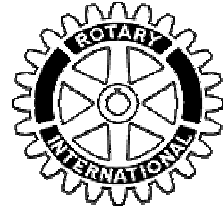

DELTA'S MILLENIUM PROJECTS

Peter Podovnikoff and Michael Owen were here to talk about these exciting projects happening in Delta to mark the new millennium. Things are happening all through the year and many projects will continue to grow over the coming years.

Some of the projects underway at the present time are upgrades to John Oliver Park (at hwy 99 & 91 junction) where the old barn is being refurbished and a millennium forest is being planted. Individuals can buy a tree to be planted in the forest, a tax-deductible tree. The playing fields are also being upgraded to all weather status for many sports. A second project in the works is a trail from Ladner along the dike to Annieville in North Delta. One of the problems was trying to figure out how to get past the area at the tunnel, but a floating bridge will serve that purpose nicely. Locals can also purchase a meter of the trail for \$100 – special obelisk markers have been manufactured to recognise the trail owners. A promise has been made that should the trail

not be completed, all monies donated will be returned to the contributor. A continuation of the trail to Tsawwassen is a problem due to the land claims presently being negotiated with the Tsawwassen First nations.

Banners and flags are available for rent or purchase to show your Delta spirit. Or you could wear a temporary tattoo or hand out stickers.

Also heavily involved in this project and thanked profusely by the speakers are Ron Toigo, John Thomas, and David Kalinovich for the Municipality. More help is always welcome.
