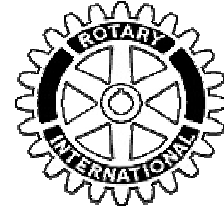

PROGRAM

Terri Laporte and Louise Mugar spoke on the Point Roberts pier project. Terri began by giving us the background of the project. It started with a presentation to Governor Gardner, who loved the idea and gave it her full support. Based on information from a study by the Port of Bellingham, the Chamber applied for a grant for the proposal from the US Forest Service. They were told they were eligible for a \$48,000 grant if they matched 20%. They raised the funds and the work began with Moffat Nichol doing the work. It was discovered that restoration of the old pier was not possible, and it would have to be completely rebuilt. Reports for the proposed project, endangered species and preferred location were taken by Louise to Washington, D.C. to acquire the necessary permits. It was a successful visit, and they now have until December 31, 2003 to raise the needed funds (they thanked us for the \$2000 that we have approved to give to them) and complete the reports prior to moving to phase three. The ideal location for the pier is at the foot of Gulf Road, but they are willing to accept other recommendations. It will be a pedestrian pier. Be 450 feet long and cost 1.7 million dollars.

ROTARY CORNER

The Rotary Foundation's oldest and best-known program is Ambassadorial Scholarships, established in 1947. Since that time, more than 30,000 men and women from 100 nations have studied abroad under its auspices. Today, the Ambassadorial Scholarships Program of The Rotary Foundation is the world's largest privately funded international scholarships program. More than 1,200 scholarships were awarded for study in 2000-01. Through grants totalling approximately US\$26 million, recipients from some 69 countries will study in more than 64 different nations.

The purpose of the Ambassadorial Scholarships program is to further international understanding and friendly relations among people of different countries. Today, the program sponsors several types of scholarships for undergraduate and graduate students as well as qualified professionals pursuing vocational studies. While abroad, scholars serve as ambassadors of goodwill to the people of the host country and give presentations about their homelands to Rotary clubs and other groups. Upon returning home, scholars share with local Rotarians and others the experiences that led to greater understanding of their host countries. A benefit not found in other scholarship programs is the scholar's association with Rotary clubs and Rotarians. Each scholar is assigned both a sponsor and a host Rotarian

counselor who provide orientation, advice, and assistance. Many former scholars serve important posts with their governments; others are highly respected in their fields.
