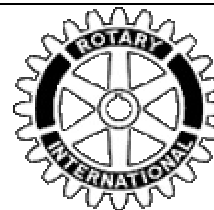

PROGRAM

Polio is a well known foe of Rotarians around the world. Joan Toone let us know of the effects of post polio syndrome. This ailment affects those who were afflicted with Polio many years ago. We have had many outbreaks of Polio here in Canada, and these epidemics paralysed tens of thousands of Canadians. It now appears that polio is most prevalent in the cleanest communities and homes, while it seemed less severe in areas where sanitation was poorer. Polio is a small virus and spreads quickly, affecting older victims much more severely than young children.

The Salk Vaccine was developed in the 50's and no new cases have shown up since in Canada, but in the 80's many people started to have unusual symptoms of muscle weakness and extreme fatigue. It now appears that neurons that grew to replace those damaged by polio, break down and no longer function properly.
