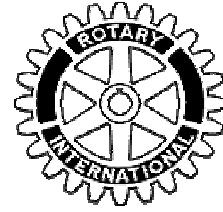

**Trick-or-Treat responds to U.S. President Bush's appeal**

Last Thursday evening, U.S. President George W. Bush appealed in a nationwide address and press conference for each child in the country to send US\$1 to the White House for the relief of Afghan children. This has launched a large national response, and key schools across the country began reporting that their students wanted to respond to President Bush's appeal rather than take part in the Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF campaign. In order to ensure continued participation in Trick-or-Treat this year, the U.S. Fund for UNICEF, in response to President Bush's appeal, will direct proceeds from the program to helping Afghan children, including polio eradication efforts. This will provide much needed help to Afghan children, and also enable health workers to continue the program to immunize these children against polio. The World Health Organization (WHO) and UNICEF estimate that in the year 2002 alone, Afghanistan needs more than US\$7 million in donor aid for its polio program. The program to support polio eradication through Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF has been extended an additional year, so that in both 2002 and 2003, all funds raised will go exclusively to polio eradication. The U.S. Fund for UNICEF has informed the press about the changes, and revised their Web site (<http://www.unicefusa.org>) with information pertaining to the support of Afghan children.
