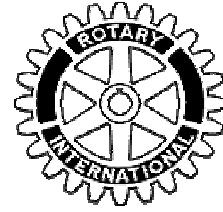

Skip Triplet from Kwantlen College updated us on what is happening with education in this province. Kwantlen is becoming well known in the world, and they have entertained visitors from China, Chile, and the USA, all wanting to study our model. Skip reminded us that education is "the future" – since lower education levels lead to higher unemployment and increased social costs. Grade point average is not the only criteria that they use to accept students, and their life long learning program offers courses to seniors as well as other adults. Kwantlen is the larger than half of the universities in Canada, and currently 60% of their courses ladder into University. Canada faces a critical shortage of skilled tradespeople, so Kwantlen has courses for them as well.

Canadian mentoring program resonates with students

The Rotary Club of Guelph, Ontario, Canada, is actively reaching out to area high school students in a popular mentoring program. With the Youth Mentorship Initiative, Rotarians have visited schools for special programs that put them face-to-face with students. In October, 30 of the club's Rotarians, spouses, and family members participated in a new Grade 9 pilot program at College Heights Secondary School, which has the

most needy ninth grade students of the area. The aim during this pilot program is to show the students that Rotarians care about them. Rotarians spend about 75 minutes each month with groups of four to six students to help them settle in the new secondary school environment. By chatting, discussing topics of mutual interest, and playing board games and cards together with students, Rotarians build student's self-esteem. This program will continue until next June. Its action committee, consisting of teachers and Rotarians, meet every couple of months to modify the approach based on lessons learned along the way. "The enthusiasm in our club for this program is electric and members have made it abundantly clear that they believe this program to be the one that most suitably addresses the urgent needs of these deserving students," said Rotarian Ron Moses, who chairs the committee responsible for the program.
